2015 Annual Benefits Enrollment, November 3 – 14



It's always important to review your medical options that you have available and make a selection that's right for you. Only you understand the health care needs that you and your family

This year, United is *going green* and will not be mailing enrollment – decision guides to homes. However, you can expect to receive your annual enrollment worksheet in the mail before the enrollment period. In addition, you will receive a benefit confirmation statement in the mail after the enrollment period. And only if you elect a new medical option for 2015 will you receive a new medical plan ID card.

<u>United and AFA announce</u> enhanced early out for flight attendants



United and the Association of Flight Attendants (AFA) announced recently that United will offer its flight

attendants an enhanced early out program. United also announced that it will be recalling all flight attendants who are on voluntary and involuntary furlough.

United will offer lump-sum payouts of up to \$100,000 for flight attendants who apply for the early out and meet certain service and eligibility qualifications. The company will award early outs in seniority order by subsidiary. United has committed to award at least 1,000 early outs at subsidiary UA, 1,000 at subsidiary CO and 100 at Continental Micronesia (CMI), and it may award more depending on the number of interested applicants.

Smooth moves: System prioritizes seat assignments after aircraft swaps

Aircraft swaps are a fact of life, but a new seat reaccommodation platform United has developed will help the company create a better experience for its customers. Previously, United's system put customers in the same



seat number, but 23B on one aircraft type is not necessarily equivalent to 23B on another. United saw customers moved from an aisle to a middle seat or from Economy Plus to United Economy

omy, and often families were split up. Rather than simply matching seat numbers, the new platform considers seat adjacency, customer status and seat type when reseating customers.

When there's an aircraft swap within 72 hours of departure, the new platform assigns crew rest seats first to support the operations. After that, it prioritizes customers based on their Premier status and fare class as well as the type of seat they've purchased. The platform puts customers in the same seat attribute (Economy Plus or exit row) and seat type (window, middle or aisle) whenever possible and maintains adjacency, so if customers are traveling together on the same PNR the new logic will reseat them together. If the same seat attribute and seat type are not available, it assigns customers into the closest, best-available seat.

LAX Customer Service Representative Glenda Laurenza recently re-accommodated 120 customers after a plane change and "everyone who had a window seat still had a window seat," she said. "It's an easy recovery when you're able to say, 'you can still get your choice of seat.' There's less confrontation, and it's less stressful for us and for the customers."

United has deployed this new platform systemwide and is seeing good performance so far. "The new platform will help to significantly improve our customer experience and minimize disruptions due to aircraft swaps," said Marketing Systems Director Kajal Narasimha. "It will also save money by cutting down on the number of refunds we have to issue when we move people from Economy Plus seats to standard economy seats."

Torgy's Travel Tips



Since I last wrote my column for September's edition, I traveled on our new 787 service non-stop from San Francisco to Chengdu, China. UA is the only airline offering non-stop service between Chengdu and the United States so this is an important route for the company. You may have never heard of Chengdu, but it is China's 4th largest city with a population of 12 million, plus

an additional 2 million in the surrounding area considered greater Chengdu. It is located in Sichuan province, in

southwest China, the gateway to Tibet. You may be more familiar with the dining tradition of hot, spicy food from this province if you frequent quality Asian restaurants. And who is not acquainted with China's most famous animal, the giant panda? Well, Chengdu is home to the Giant Panda Breeding and Research Center. Commercially, Chengdu is the up and coming high-tech center of China which makes our route to SFO an economic treasure. The flights are timed perfectly for departure and arrival at each city and ground operations at the Chengdu airport are handled extremely well. As a standby, I was afforded the upmost in courtesy and was given clear instructions where to check-in, and where to wait in the lobby for flight clearance. I was lucky to get a businessfirst seat both ways – a great way to use a vacation pass because the flight is over 14 hours long.

But Chengdu has much more to offer. The city is home to the 1 year old Global Center - the 2nd largest building by floor space in the world (second only to Dubai Intl Airport's terminal 2). This architecturally gorgeous building houses a huge hotel, a water park with beach, hundreds of stores and restaurants, movie theatres, ice-rink, and offices. It is located in Tianfu, the city's new high-tech zone, easily accessible via subway and bus. Directly across the street is one of many beautiful parks with a lake, bike trails and walking paths. Of course, there is a Starbuck's on the corner! A visit to the Giant Panda Breeding and Research Center is a must for animal lovers and you get to see the baby pandas in the nursery plus juveniles and adult pandas frolicking all around. The park-like grounds are beautiful and there are red pandas, swans and peacocks to view as well. If you book in advance, you can choose the option of the "opportunity to hold a panda". The cost is USD \$550 "donation". This opportunity consists of donning sterile coverings and having a panda weighing about 60 lbs placed on your lap for about 20 seconds or less, depending on the demeanor of the animal. The panda is usually placed with its back to your chest – you cannot see the face. They take a photo of you and the panda and then whisk you out quickly so the next guest can enter. It is a once-in-a-lifetime experience for most people so it is popular and the money goes directly to research support. But there are plenty of opportunities to view the pandas quite closely without choosing this extra option if cost is a factor.

My first visit to Chengdu was in 2000 and the changes that have occurred here in the last 14 years have been astounding. Where there once were outdoor street markets with live chickens, rabbits and eels ready for the farmer to butcher on the spot, there are now gleaming supermarkets. Bicycles are nearly nonexistent now, having been replaced by electric motor scooters. Freeways and toll roads are new and are jammed with cars by Mercedes, Ford, GM, Toyota, BMW, etc., not compact cars like in Europe. Post offices handle banking - letters and stamps are a thing of the past being usurped by electronic

data. My effort to purchase a few postcards and mail them to the US turned out to be a lesson in futility. I did manage to finally find some cards to buy and a post office worker, after much pleading, did dust off an old box from the back room containing stamps, but my mail was evidently never picked up from the duct-taped "China Post" mail box. It's been 3 months and nary a card has arrived!

Opportunities abound for sightseeing within and outside the city and most all signs are posted in Mandarin and English, both on the roads as well as street signs and public transportation kiosks. The city is clean and safe, but as in most Asian cities, only drink bottled water. In the evenings, don't be surprised to find what look like "flash mobs" popping up with coordinated dancing and music with participants ranging from kids to elders in their 80's and 90's! This is a common pastime occurring on empty school grounds and corner parks in the early twilight. It's quite a delightful way for residents to join their neighbors and get a little exercise at the same time. Until next time, happy travels!

For this month's Newsletter we would like to share some information about **Russ Currier**. Russ is unique in many ways. For example, he is a rare individual who is a native of California. Russ was born in San Mateo February, 1925 and raised in Palo Alto where he graduated from High School in 1942.

After High School, Russ enrolled in a Civil Service sponsored program to train in aircraft maintenance for the U.S. Army Air Corp (USAAC), later to become the U.S. Army Air Force (USAAF). Once the training was completed Russ was assigned to work at Hamilton Field, San Rafael, CA (which was surplused by the military and was officially vacated in 1995).

The United States was now in WWII and Russ had turned 18 so he was drafted into the Army. He did his basic training in Fresno, CA. then sent to Mississippi for B-24 technical training. After completion of this training Russ was sent to Florida to train as an Air Gunner. The B-24 Liberator, also known as the" Flying Boxcar", was a heavy bomber with a long range ability and was a forerunner to precision-guided munitions. One might recall that Lieutenant Joseph P. Kennedy Jr. was the pilot of a B-24 that exploded in mid-air in an unexplained accident.

After completing the Air Gunner course Russ was assigned to a new B17 Flying Fortress crew for combat. Russ reflects how this reinforces the idea of "standard military procedure"; i.e. trained on a B-24 and assigned to a B-17.

Due to his specialized training, Russ was the ranking enlisted man, yet the youngest member of the crew, so he didn't let his age be known. During B-17 training there was a catastrophic incident in which a check pilot made an unsafe command, insisting that the squadron fly into a thunderhead between two cathedral clouds, and Russ's plane was so badly damaged it had to be scrapped and another plane in the military exercise broke in half and the crew perished.

After about 3 months Russ's crew received a new B-17 and headed to a base about 30 miles north of London where they were stationed and flew 35 missions! (Some Trivia: Clark Gable flew 5 missions as a waist gunner. Tom Landry flew 30 missions as a B-17 pilot, and James Stewart flew 20 combat missions in B-24s.) Russ's missions included raids on Berlin, Dresden, Battle of the Bulge, and oil targets in central Germany and the Ruhr Valley. Russ states that his Bomber Squadron encountered fierce opposition as well as encountering the new Messerschmitt Me262—the aircraft that was the world's first jet fighter! On one mission they lost both starboard engines, but the pilot was able to return the aircraft to the base on two engines, and the pilot received the Distinguished Flying Cross for his flying skill. Russ returned to the United States from the war in Europe in March 1945. When people hear of his remarkable story he says that this was "just high school and college age kids doing what they were trained to do".

Russ attended Cal Areo Tech in Glendale, CA and Northrup Institute in Englewood, Ca. after World War II. He began working for United Air Lines (UAL) in May, 1948. Russ was an Engine Shop Mechanic until 1955. He was first to pass the new Initiated Exam and became a Shop Inspector. It was during this time, 1959, Russ

worked on procurement and the setup of Tooling and Equipment for the Jet Engine Shop. Russ was a Test Cell Foreman from 1966 until 1972, after which he became a Shop Inspector until his retirement in November, 1987 from SFOPI.

Once retired, Russ was able to enjoy his hobby of woodworking, and furniture building. He also enjoyed traveling when his wife, Joanne, was well. One of the most memorable trips was a Safari in Kenya.

Russ's wife, Joanne, was a Registered Nurse who worked in Labor and Delivery Rooms. They have two daughters, one who is a Carmelite Nun. They had a grandson who served two deployments in Iraq, came home, graduated from college, and tragically, was killed in a motorcycle accident.

Russ is reluctant to talk about himself, but with "gentle urging" we were able to get him to share some of his experiences! Thank you for your service to our country, Russ, as well as your sense of humor, and for being a tremendous addition to the UAL family.
